				<p>So if the cost of moving Parliament to Pretoria is R7 billion, and we see an annual savings of R750 million, it will roughly take 10 years before we see any "gains" from it. We actually need the R7 billion NOW to address bigger fires (metaphorically speaking) than the ones that occurred in Capetown.</p> <p>Firstly, despite SOEs the government makes no positive income other than tax money that's collected. So the government is one giant expenditure all together.</p> <p>Second, even if we did take the plunge to move, how can we know that those "savings" will be better spent? It can just be reallocated to some other expenditure that will benefit someone in government or parliament (and thus the whole "savings" argument falls over).</p> <p>Third, I'm no expert in these matters but something tells me that having a physical and logical separation between administrative and legislative branches is important and that once the physical move is completed, the logical barriers might soon follow and so far it is one of the few things still helping us as citizens fight against the corrupt establishment.</p> <p>Fourth, and this is very speculative but could Malema also think of using this move to Pretoria as a means to intimidate people who want to attend by arranging large rallies there (since its easier, cheaper, closer in Pretoria than in Capetown)? This is not out of the realm of possibility and once the large expenditure has been paid, there is no turning back.
